

Important safety notice: Coyotes in the neighborhood

We want to make the community aware that coyotes have been spotted in the area and there have been attacks on domesticated pets. Our four-legged best friends need you now more than ever to keep them protected, as Coyotes are here and hungry. They are wild animals, and even small lapses in attention can put our four-legged friends at risk.

Please:

- Do not leave pets unattended outdoors
- Keep pets on a SHORT leash, especially during early morning and evening hours
- Avoid feeding wildlife and stray cats (intentionally or unintentionally)
- Report aggressive or repeated sightings.
