Love Our Furry Friends

The other day I took a few steps to help a neighbor and — OUCH.

Big mistake.

And to think people walk their dogs on that pavement? Don't be that person.

When the air hits 85°, asphalt can reach 140°, and paws can burn in seconds.

Quick test: press the back of your hand to the pavement and hold for 7 seconds.

If you can't, neither can they.

Walk early, walk late, stick to grass and shade — and if your dog is panting hard, get them inside.

Heat exhaustion in dogs is real and fast.

Our pets count on us to make the calls they can't.

TOO HOT TO TROT



Hot pavement can burn your dog's paws and lead to heat exhaustion or heatstroke.



Temperatures can reach up to:

AIR TEMPERATURE	CONCRETE	ASPHALT
75°	90°	125°
80°	95°	130°
85°	105°	135°
90°	125°	140°
95°	140°	150°

Asphalt can be 40-60 degrees hotter than the air temperature. Test the pavement. Hold the back of your hand down for 10 seconds, if it burns your hand, it can burn your dog's paws.
